Located on Blounts Bay near Chocowinity, North Carolina, Herbert C. Bonner Scout Reservation is a nationally accredited Boy Scout Facility.

Overlooking the Pamlico River the camp offers scout units, private organizations and corporations the perfect location to conduct a get-away-from-it-all event and/or retreat to enjoy the great outdoors.

The camp has an air-conditioned dining hall, meeting areas, shower facilities and sheltered off-season sleeping accommodations for up to 50 people.

Arrangements can be made to supply food and cook crews for all your meal time needs.

Trained and certified camp staff members are available to plan and support any COPE activity desired by your group.

The Camp Bonner COPE program consist of team building activities, low-course, high-course, zip-line slide and a climbing/rappelling tower.

Scheduling the COPE Program

Because of the time involved in completing the COPE program, organizations should determine what their goals are for their stay at Camp Bonner. To complete all the phases of the full program a full weekend is needed.

The total program begins with a training session on Friday evening followed by a few team building exercises. Following breakfast on Saturday morning there are additional team building activities and the start of the low-course area. On completion of the low-course participants will then move over to the high-course. Completion of the high-course is determined by the amount of participants and the speed and agility of the participants.

The finishing element of the high-course is an exhilarating ride on the zip-line slide. Participants will then move to the 45 ft. climbing/rappelling tower.

Completion of the course may take until late Saturday or Sunday morning.

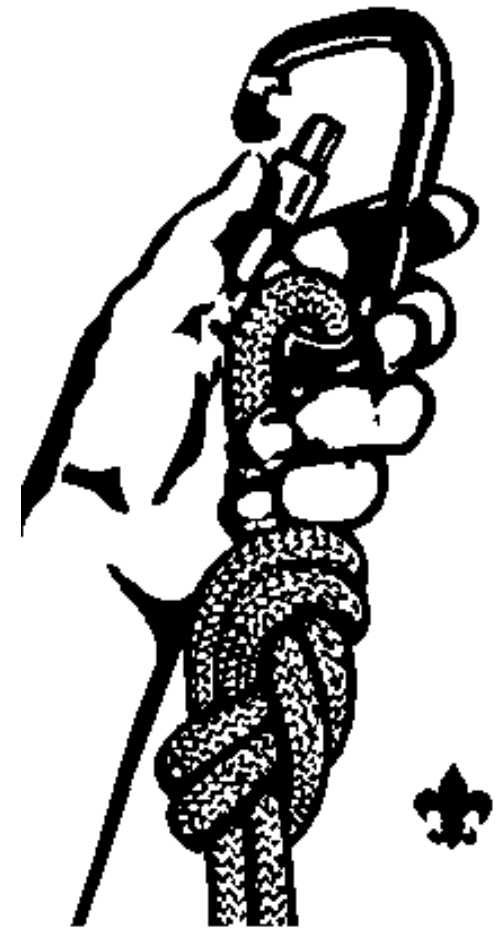
