

## Camp Bonner Emergency Action Plan

In the event of a camp emergency, notify the Camp Director, Program Director, Camp Ranger, and/or the Camp Medical Officer immediately. Where an emergency involving a camper is concerned, the appropriate troop leader will be contacted.

**Emergency phone numbers are posted at each phone location.**

### Camp Emergencies

With the exception of a fire emergency, all campers are to report immediately to their campsite upon hearing an emergency signal. In the case of a weather emergency, campers should seek protective shelter in the nearest ravine or strong structure. Campers should remain in a safe location until the "All Clear" signal has been given. Leaders should review these procedures with their campers.

**The following emergency signals will be used:**

<b>Fire Alarm:</b>	Three (3) blasts of a car or air horn throughout camp. Camper report to the dining hall and conduct a unit role call.
<b>Lost Bather Procedure:</b>	A continuous car or air horn blast throughout camp. Campers report to their campsite for unit role call.
<b>Weather Emergency:</b>	Whistle blast throughout camp. Campers should immediately seek cover in the nearest structure or ravine. Report to campsite for role call after the all-clear is sounded.
<b>All Clear:</b>	Reveille bugle call on the public address system
<b>Health Emergencies:</b>	The camp health officer will respond to all health emergency situations.

### Storm Condition Warnings

**Storm Condition 1:** *Storm Condition 1* indicates the danger of severe storms in the immediate camp area. High winds, heavy rains, flooding, severe lightning and thunder is anticipated. Small boat warnings are normally issued during this condition requiring that all boats return to shore. Campers should prepare for the worst. *Condition 1* is noted by three (3) storm flags flying from the storm condition flag pole at the Ecology/Conservation Area. Weather emergency signal may be sounded & storm condition up-dates given over the camp staff communications radio net. Search out cover if needed. Camp programs will stop when the warning is given.

**Storm Condition 2:** *Storm Condition 2* indicates the presence of strong storms in the immediate area. Moderate winds, rain, some flooding and possible lightning may be experienced. *Condition 2* is noted by two (2) storm flags flying from the flag pole. All boats should return to shore. Campers should prepare their campsites for rain and wind. Some camp programs may be curtailed.

**Storm Condition 3:** *Storm Condition 3* indicates that there may be some rain and higher than normal winds in the immediate area of camp. *Condition 3* is noted by one (1) storm flag flying from the storm condition flag pole. Campers should prepare their sites for rain. Camp program will continue.

### Heat Stress Index Advisory Plan

**Black Flag:** (90+ degree + 70% humidity) Camp will experience extremely high temperatures and humidity levels. All nonessential outside physical activity will stop. Hydration measures are to be undertaken.

**Red Flag:** (88 to 89.9 degree + 75% humidity) Camp will experience high temperatures and humidity levels. All nonessential outside physical activity should be carefully monitored or stopped. All campers should carry water.

**Yellow Flag:** (85 to 87.9 degree + 90% humidity) Camp will experience moderately high temperatures plus high humidity. All participants in outside physical activity should drink plenty of water. Monitor all activity and participants.

**Green Flag:** (80 to 84.9 degree + 95% humidity) Camp will experience moderate temperatures with humidity. Care should be taken while conducting outside strenuous activity.

***Heat Index flags will be flown from the Ecology/Conservation Area flag pole.***
